AC Report

I am currently 19 years old and going to university here in Saskatoon, and I am in the Next Steps 4-H Club. As an AC I had a couple duties to serve for my half-term of one year. During my service this year, I had to go to a few meetings to discuss my roles and of course do my training, and outside of that it was a breeze. Generally, the AC meeting agenda consists of reporting on completed AC duties; preparing for upcoming 4-H events; answering questions and offering feedback to the Board of Directors about member-related business, policies, programs and BOD ad hoc committees; and planning for the Annual General Meeting and our role at it. But after all of the formal things I got to go out and meet some of you folks and other members from across the province. Two registered members 18 -year old members who sit on the Board (and who offer expertise based on experience gained as a member.)

One Board Leader Representative appointed by the Board of Directors.

Two 4-H Staff Coordinators organize and are present during all Advisory Council Trailing, and are available to answer any questions, offer guidance, or assist as necessary.

Advisory Council members are expected to complete several duties in their terms on the Council. Duties fall under the categories of "Advisory Council Musts", "Public Presentations", "Assistance within the 4-H Program", and "4-H Education."

There were a few things that I liked about the AC Role, and that was the amount of contribution I got to make to the 4-H community in Saskatchewan. Seeing how things worked and volunteering and recruiting folks on behalf of our awesome group of 4-H'ers was awesome this year. I've gotten the chance to learn that all the folks in the 4-H office and on the Board of Directors work insanely hard to make sure all of us members get the chance to enjoy the program, while at the same time being some of the kindest people out there. Like seriously, I'd probably be quite snarly and angry if I had to do all the hard work they do! Makayla Buekert

This year District 22 has 8 clubs: Herds of Thunder with 18 members, CC Ryders has 10 members, Clavet Multiple with 23, Old Bone Trail Multiple has 23, Saskatoon Beef with 33, Toon Town has 7, and Vanscoy Multiple with 25 for a total of 174.

District 22 meets twice a year, once in the fall and in the spring. This year district public speaking was hosted by Sunset Rangers and there were 46 participants. Our district has not hosted any regional or provincial event this year. A few members of District 22 participated in the prairieland leadership conference this year. We raise money by selling tote bags as well as charging a district membership fee. We had two people from our district win Saskatchewan scholarships as well as two district scholarships last year, we also held a district ski day at Table Mountain.

Catherwood: Catherwood Beef & Sheep 4-H Club has 6 members & 4 leaders this year. Projects offered are Beef, Sheep, Scrapbooking & Youth Leadership projects this year. Catherwood has 1 beef member, 4 sheep members, 2 scrapbooking members & 1 youth leadership member. We have members participating in multiple projects this year. Club Activities resumed this year including:

- Club meeting are held monthly.
- Club held a cookie mix in a jar fundraiser in December 2022. Fundraiser was a huge success. Jars were made by members and sold.
- Participated in Club Speeches on February 2023.
- Achievement day is planned for end of June 2023.
- Club members decided that each year they would like to host a fundraiser with proceeds being donated to STAR Ambulance in memory of their beef leader Dean Horn who passed in January 2022.
- Shyanne Magnus is our Youth Leadership member. For her project Shyanne organized a silent auction at the North West Regional Curling event with proceeds being donated to STARS Ambulance. Proceeds from the silent auction totaled \$1,230.00. Presentation of proceeds will be made to STARS in April 2023.

Monarch: Monarch Multiple 4-H 27 members and 10 leaders this year. Projects offered this year are Beef, Light Horse & Trail riders. The members are busy working on their projects and enjoying less restrictions this year. Members were excited to have a Christmas party again this year. Achievement day planning has started to take place.

Monarch hosted District speeches on February 17, 2023.

District 23 hosted North West Regional Curling on January 14, 2023 at the Biggar Curling Rink.

District 24

(As presented at AGM) We have 3 clubs in our district Kerrobert Major and Handel. We each offer many different projects to our membership. We have 2 meetings each year, one in the fall and the other in the spring. We each take turns hosting our district public speaking competition as well as sending voting delegates to AGM. We hosted NW Regional public speaking in the spring of 2022. We also offer an annual scholarship to our graduating members.
