## Background \& Considerations

In 2004, 4-H Saskatchewan reduced its regions from six to four due to fewer 4-H clubs, and the need to serve our existing clubs with more focused programming from dedicated staff. Twenty years later, the restructuring process continues. In 2024, the regional boundaries are being reduced from four to three, in adjustment to our membership size.

Some districts also are undergoing an adjustment to size, based on club numbers and membership sizes within, and other district-specific needs that are currently not being met. The following district-specific pages explain how and why each district is changing, and how future requirements and essentials will be met.

Staff will continue to assist clubs and districts as they adjust to these changes, beginning with this booklet and accompanying PowerPoint presentation. More specifically, this booklet gives an individual look at how these changes will affect each district.

## 4-H Saskatchewan—Current Regional Map



The map to the left indicates our current four regions, each with nine to 11 Districts.

Regions are North West, North East, South West and South East.

Due to the North West position not being filled for almost two years, the current Regional 4-H Specialist team has absorbed other districts into their regional fold to ensure all districts and clubs within are being served:

South West: Districts 3/4, 8, 9, 10, 11, 16, 17, 40, 22, 23, 24, 30, 35.

North East: Districts 42, 43, 21, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, 34, 38, 36, 33, 32, 31.

South East: Districts 1, 2, 5, 6, 7, 12, 13, 14, 18/19, 20, 37, 39, 41.

Clubs: Aneroid Multiple 4-H Club (7), Val Marie 4-H Light Horse Club (13), Wood River 4-H Club (10), Mankota 4-H Beef Club (31)

Totals: 4 clubs, 61 members
Details: The only major change to District $3 / 4$ would be its inclusion into the newly created West 4-H Region. Districts 3 and 4 amalgamated in 2017, when District 3 only had one club. This merge resulted in the District becoming very run with good communication and participation. It already covers a large geographical area. One club folded in 2023-2024.

Totals: 5 clubs, 74 members
Details: District 8 would retain its usual boundaries; However it would formally become a part of the West 4-H Region. District 8 is very well run with great involvement from the clubs and executive. It already covers a large geographical area. It is host to the Moose Jaw Regional Show.

Details: This District would retain its usual boundaries, though it would formally become part of the newly formed West 4-H Region. District 9 is a well-run district with a strong executive. It has the largest club and member base in the current South West region, with many clubs attend the Swift Current Regional Show.

Details: District 10 will retain its usual boundaries, with its only major change being formally inducted into the West 4-H Region. This District is well-run with good club participation. It covers a smaller area, yet they host their own Regional District 10 Show and Sale

Totals: 7 clubs, 79 members
Details: District 11 and District 17 would merge as one, and become a part of the West 4-H Region. Dst 11 has three clubs with a central location of Kindersley. Both districts have clubs that are very involved.

Details: The only major change that District 16 will see in 4-H Saskatchewan's Restructure is that it will formally become a part of the West 4-H Region. It is a well run District with good communication. It currently covers a large geographical area, and had one new club join in 2023-2024.

From Dst 23: Catherwood Beef and Sheep 4-H Club (11), Monarch Multiple 4-H Club (17), United 4-H Beef Club (8)

Totals: 11 clubs, 203 members
Details: District 23 has a low number of clubs, whereas District 22 a very large well run district. There is a grand-scale Regional Show in Saskatoon where light horse, beef, sheep and dairy attend. It is less than 100 km between the two farthest clubs.

Details: Districts $\mathbf{2 4 / 3 0}$ would combine to be one larger area. As well, they would formally become a part of the West 4-H Region. Both districts have three clubs or less, and combining the two would result in fairness in competition and opportunities to compete in district events. There is a Regional show in Kerrobert.
