

4-H Saskatchewan Representative to 4-H Canada YAC (Youth Advisory Committee)

INFORMATION

The 4-H Canada Youth Advisory Committee (YAC) is the national youth voice for 4-H Canada. The committee is made up of one senior representative from each 4-H organization across Canada.

YAC provides leadership opportunities for outstanding young people from across the country who have been involved in 4-H and want to continue to play a role and contribute to the 4-H movement in Canada.

The YAC member serves a two-year term with a possibility of an extension. Please read the eligibility requirements and responsibilities below, and the job description on the next page. You can learn more at www.4-h-canada.ca/yac.

Eligibility Requirements:

- Must be between 18-25 years of age (as of February 1, 2022)
- Must be a current or past 4-H member. Preference given to current Saskatchewan 4-H members but past members will be considered as well.
- Must have at least two years of experience as a Saskatchewan 4-H member
- Must possess a good understanding of 4-H at the provincial and/or national level
- Must be willing and able to travel independently in Canada.

4-H Saskatchewan Responsibilities:

In addition to the responsibilities listed on the 4-H Canada YAC Job Description on the next page, 4-H Saskatchewan has additional responsibilities for the Youth Advisory Committee member.

The 4-H Canada YAC member sits on 4-H Saskatchewan's Youth Advisory Council. The purpose of the council is to provide a youth voice to the Saskatchewan Board of Directors. The responsibilities include:

- Attend Saskatchewan 4-H Advisory Council training weekend
- Participate on conference calls with Advisory Council during the year
- Share your national YAC committee perspective with these provincial counterparts
- Share the voice of Saskatchewan 4-H members with your national counterparts
- Attend the Saskatchewan 4-H Council AGM
- Saskatchewan Advisory Council members also have a list of required duties (club or public presentation to promote 4-H or educate 4-H members). Given the responsibility of the YAC role, these AC responsibilities are optional for the YAC member.

Youth Advisory Committee

Member Job Description

The Youth Advisory Committee (YAC) is the national youth voice for 4-H Canada, providing leadership opportunities for outstanding young people from across the country who are currently active 4-H members or recent alumni. Our YAC members – one per province for a total of 12 members – are youth who want to continue to play a role and contribute to the 4-H movement in Canada.

As a YAC member and the youth voice for 4-H Canada, you are a strong leader and a team player, be willing to share your opinions and perspectives and be respectful and trustworthy. Above all, you are passionate about 4-H, and an advocate to its potential.

Selection Criteria and Requirements

Candidate YAC members must:

- be between the age of 18 and 25;
- be a current 4-H member in good standing or recent alumni (within three years);
- commit to volunteer at least two hours per month, and additional time as required;
- attend and actively participate in all scheduled meetings and events;
- demonstrate an interest in public speaking, group facilitation and in being a team player;
- demonstrate knowledge of 4-H at the local, provincial and national levels;
- be willing to travel within Canada when required.

Responsibilities

- Attend and participate actively in all in-person and teleconference meetings.
- Participate actively in assigned working groups. Tasks include:
 - Assisting 4-H Canada staff in the planning and facilitation of national conferences;
 - o Acting in an advisory capacity to 4-H Canada staff on various topics;
 - Representing 4-H youth members at the national level to the 4-H Canada Board of Directors.
- Represent 4-H Canada within provinces and promote national programs and opportunities through provincial networks.
- Represent 4-H Canada at various events and promote national programs and opportunities.
- Be a positive role model for 4-H members.
- Represent provinces and complete all provincial duties as required.
- Share 4-H Canada events and key messages with networks within 4-H.

Structure and Time Commitment

- One youth advisor is selected from each province
- Participate in five to six YAC meetings held per year by teleconference, with one in-person meeting per year
- Participate in one working group per year, where meeting frequency is determined by the working group
- Travel and participate in a minimum of one national event per year that will be coordinated by 4-H Canada (to be determined)

Benefits of Being a YAC Member

- Gain volunteer experience as part of a national committee
- Develop and expand on career skills including leadership, facilitation and teamwork
- Travel across Canada through various opportunities
- Create new networks and friendships
