Canadian National 4-H & Youth Judging Competition 2022!

4-H and youth judges from across Canada competed in the 2022 Canadian National 4-H & Youth Judging Competition at Canadian Western Agribition on November 27 – 29, 2022. Competitors judged nine classes including animals, grains and forage. Competitors then gave written and oral reasons on each of the classes to a panel of knowledgeable judges, receiving both a placings and reasons score.

After some free time at Canadian Western Agribition, the Awards Banquet was held. The Honourable David Marit, Saskatchewan Minister of Agriculture, spoke to the competitors about the importance of agriculture, and thanked them for being model representatives for the Agriculture industry.

The pinnacle of the evening was guest speaker J.J. Hunter of the Hunter Brothers and NHL fame. J.J. shared his own life experiences with the group and brought forward three challenges to the youth: What do you want to be; How are you going to get there; What will you leave when you're done?

The results for the competition were then announced, and are listed below. The group was also joined by representatives from sponsors TD Canada Trust, Ag Services and Corteva Agriscience. Thank you to all sponsors, judges, chaperones, committee members, volunteers and supporters.

The top three competitors then took part in a Judging Finals competition, where they each judged a class of cattle, instructing a ringman and giving oral reasons over a microphone to an audience and Finals judge. The winner from the final competition was Kyle Yaremko, with **Grace Christensen** (4-H Saskatchewan Alumni!!) coming in second and Molly Severtson in third. Kyle will be given the honour of judging at the First Lady Classic!

CYSA is poised for continued success as a premier youth public speaking competition and as a leader

in Canadian agricultural communications. The senior competition is for young adults aged 16-24 while the junior competition is for youth aged 11-15. Each speech is 5-7 minutes in length. Competitors are scored on 120 points: 60 points for presentation and 60 points for content.

CYSA's mission is to provide Canadian youth with a professional public speaking competition through which they can develop communication skills and workforce skills demanded by Canada's competitive agriculture and agri-food industry. The competition is focused on Youth Empowerment, Skill Development, Connections and Integrity.

Competitors had to research one of the five topics they were given to speak about in Agriculture, Both Amber and Hunter spoke about "I realized I wanted a career in agriculture when..." Judges' remarks were that this year was the hardest competition they've ever judged and had a tough time placing competitors. Each competitor received a RAWF 100th

Anniversary poster, certificate of achievement and blue participant ribbon. Hunter and Amber both placed second runner up, and received a beautiful blue, red and white 3rd place ribbon and monetary placement.



Charlie's 4-H lesson: "4-H is really fun and is teaching me to work hard and meet new forever friends!"





4-H Saskatchewan's **Emily Sebastian** from Montmarte, SK was the recipient of one of these scholarships.




