ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

West

District #3/4 Report

Our district consists of 4 clubs, Val Marie Light Horse, Wood River Light Horse, Mankota Beef and Aneroid Multiple. In total we have 46 members between our four clubs, we are small but dedicated to making our 4-H clubs amazing and inclusive.

Wood River 4-H Club

There are 10 members in our group, 2 cloverbuds, 3 juniors, 5 intermediates. We had a scavenger hunt for our Halloween ride. Beautiful day outside so took advantage of it. We had our Christmas party on December 15 in Regina at the skypark. Fun was had by absolutely everyone. We hosted a horsemanship clinic again this year just to keep freshened up. We have been working in the concession at Lafleche rink to fundraise. Not too much riding has been done this winter due to the cold temperatures but that gave us time to work on books, looking forward to the spring so we can get back into the arena. Hoping to get another clinic of some sort booked like roping, barrels. February 23 we got our club level public speaking finished and held District 3/4 meeting and speeches on March 9th, now we are anxious to see what members move onto regionals and provincials.

Val Marie 4-H Light Horse Club

We have 8 members in our club. Since the last district meeting our club held a Christmas get together at the movies in Swift Current. We have completed our covered record book projects, completed speeches and are halfway thru completing the required pages for our workbooks. We have a couple more record book meetings coming up the end of March and April. We will host a tack cleaning session in April and start getting ready to ride. We have a horsemanship and beginner roping clinic booked for May. We are hoping to have a couple more clinics, a trail ride and a vet talk along with our weekly riding sessions leading up to our Achievement Day the beginning of October.

District #3/4 Report

Aneroid Multiple 4-H Club

We have 5 members: 2 seniors and 3 intermediates, most of are involved in multiple projects within the club. On December 21, we had a Christmas party where we went swimming, shopping, and finished with supper at Akropol in Swift Current. Our delicious chili Appreciation Supper and bingo night was on January 29. Then on March 2, we had our Club Speeches. Madison Kress (Intermediate) got 1st place, Taylor McMillian (Intermediate) got 2nd place, Sierra Condie (Senior) got 1st and Lacie Bloom (Senior) got 2nd place. There are 3 members in photography. They are busy learning about their cameras and now that spring has arrived plan to get out and about and capture the world around them. There is 1 member in foods. They have had a couple of meetings in which they made some cakes and cookies. There are 4 members in Cricut. We have had several meetings this year. We have done shadow boxes, wood burning and cards. We are creating St. Patrick's Day shirts as well as decorating coffee mugs with permanent vinyl for our next project. There are 2 members in quilting. They have finished their first quilt. Sierra C. created a "mirror mirror" pattern quilt for her project and donated it to her grade 12 graduating fundraiser. Madison K. finished her "mirror mirror" quilt that she started last spring. Both are now working on a second quilt, Sierra is currently finishing up the "mirror mirror" quilt that she started last spring and Madison has also started a second quilt using 10" blocks (referred to as a cake of 42 squares) and creating a pattern. Both of these girls will complete these second quilts by the end of this 4-H year.

Mankota 4-H Beef Club

We have 23 members in our club. Over the winter we worked on our record books, our annual weigh day, held a demonstration with workshops on tagging, implanting and digestive tract in cattle. We will be holding meeting, in the near future, about clipping and preparing our cattle for showing. Our achievement day is planned in June. Our Intermediates and Seniors have gone to the Feedlot at Hazenmore, SK. The feedlot is allowing the members to track a pen of steers over the course of the winter and spring, on their growth and feed consumption. After our Achievement Day, we head off to Frontier Days in Swift to compete in the 4-H events of Judging, Showing and Steer sale.

District #8 Report

District #8 is made up of 5 clubs, Old Wives 4-H Club, Moose Jaw 4-H Beef Club, Missouri Coteau 4-H Multiple Club, Thunder Creek 4-H Club, and Briercrest 4-H Multiple Club. They have 2 meetings a year, one in October and one in February. This year, District #8 has 55 members (plus Briercrest). District #8 hosted Regional Curling last year in Moose Jaw. Unfortunately, attendance was low due to the weather. Here are some reports from our clubs. The Moose Jaw Co-Op held a Be Ranch Ready Contest at the Canadian Western Agribition in Regina last November. Attendees were able to nominate community organizations for a \$1000 donation. On February 3rd, 2025, the winners were announced and our District is proud to say that 3 of our clubs, Old Wives, Moose Jaw Beef, and Missouri Coteau each won a \$1000 donation. They would like to thank all those for nominating their clubs.

The Old Wives Club has 11 members and 2 leaders. They offer Beef and Sheep projects. This is their 50th Anniversary and they will be hosting a celebration on June 7th. They had a bottle drive at the beginning of their 4-H year and will be having a raffle fundraiser during the rest of the year. The winner will be announced during their achievement day. They've had weigh-ins for their steers and sheep and held a winter fun day by going bowling and having pizza. They hosted the District #8 public speaking competition on March 2nd. Their beef members are excited to get to the show season where they will be attending Spring Shows in their areas and the sheep members will be auctioning off their market lambs at their achievement day.

The Thunder Creek 4-H Club has 7 members. Their club offers the light horse project. They held their public speaking competition on March 14th. They lost their general leader so re-organizing has been a priority this year. They hosted a Christmas and skating party. They will begin riding and having horsemanship clinics in May. Their achievement day is in July.

The Briercrest 4-H Multiple Club has 10 members: 1 Cloverbud, 3 Juniors, 4 Intermediates, and 2 Seniors. Their club keeps busy with a 4-U project, Best of the Bakery, Crafts and Outdoor Living.

District #8 Report

The Moose Jaw 4-H Beef Club has 12 members and 3 leaders. Their club offers solely beef projects with members showing steer, heifer, 2-year old and 3-year old cow/calf projects. This 4-H year, they will be focusing on touring agricultural operations and career exploration. The club continues to host their annual bottle drive and this year added a service component to the bottle drive. The bottle caps collected will go to the Moose Jaw Extended Care Seniors where they will use the bottle caps to make a mural. Additionally, the soda can tabs will be donated to Cancer for Kids through the RM of Baildon. In January, they held a practice skills day as members learned about body condition scoring, injection techniques, tying knots as well as implanting and ear tagging by using cadaver cattle ears. They will be having a clip and wash day in April and their achievement day is May 31st. The members will also be competing at the Moose Jaw Inter 4-H Regional Show and Sale in June.

The Missouri Coteau 4-H Multiple Club has 25 members and 8 leaders. Their club offers projects such as Light horse, Beef, Woodworking, Poultry, 4U Self Determined with a focus on entrepreneurship and Outdoor Living. They hold a general meeting every month and project meetings once a month. Unfortunately due to the cold weather this year, many meetings were cancelled but they hope to make that up come spring time. The Poultry members went to Alberta and attended a poultry show. The 4U members made soap and bath bombs which they sold at a couple of local trade shows. The Woodworking members have been building such projects as picnic tables and bedroom furniture. The beef project went on a tour of a feedlot and learned how to prepare for calving season that included a hands-on demonstration. The light horse members went on some rides and had a nextra special ride through the Badlands near Avonlea. The Outdoor Living members went ice fishing and will also be going dog-sledding trek at the end of March. This is the club's 10th anniversary and will be celebrating at their year end fun day in June.
