

## We're all representing 4-H!

4-H Saskatchewan expects our members, leaders, family and supporters to follow all applicable guidelines at all times for the safety of our clubs, our communities, our country and our world!

## A picture is worth a thousand words!

**Please look at your photos closely and think before you post! Make sure you are positively representing 4-H!**

4-H clubs should be attentive if posting photos of club activities taken before restrictions are in place or where not all participants appear to be adhering to the guidelines. For example, a photo from Achievement Day in 2019 where everyone is gathered closely together for a group picture or a photo of a 4-H member smiling with their horse and leader without masks (taken prior to mask restrictions being in place) both appear to be breaking the rules! Posting photos that show a lack of social distancing or a participant without a mask at a 4-H event (without context) on social media may lead to damage to 4-H's reputation. If you do choose to post a photo, consider adding a caption to describe when/where it was taken.



If photos are reported to 4-H, we will investigate and if public health orders were not followed, the member or club could be at risk of losing their good standing.

## We're in this together

**We expect our 4-H clubs to meet and exceed public health orders to ensure the safety of our youth and the reputation of our activities.**

If even one 4-H activity or club disregards public health orders, this could impact our entire organizations' ability to hold events and activities for our members. Hold your 4-H event to the highest standard, follow all of the guidelines, and we can all make sure 4-H'ers are able to continue holding events and activities (within limits provided).

Please report any suspected 4-H non-compliance to the 4-H Office and to Saskatchewan Public Health. If an individual or club is found to have disregarded public health orders, the member or club could be at risk of losing their good standing or other penalties as deemed appropriate.
